Mountain Lion: AKA: Cougar, Puma, Panther, Ghost Cat



Mountain Lions Play a Pivotal & Critical Role in Nature

- A top predator: helps maintain biodiversity and ecosystems.
- An umbrella species: conserving its habitat, ensures conservation of other species.
- Helps control deer, big horn sheep by reducing overgrazing.
- May kill coyotes and bobcats, thereby influencing their populations and contributing to a more balanced ecosystem.

How to Avoid or Survive an Encounter With a Mountain Lion

- 1. Don't plan outdoor activities between dusk to dawn
- 2. Don't hike, walk or camp alone
- 3. Don't walk, camp near dense growth, rock outcroppings
- 4. Don't act afraid of a lion, don't freeze or panic
- 5. Don't try to soothe it verbally, yell, but don't scream
- 6. Never turn your back on a lion
- 7. Don't bend over, crouch, or kneel
- 8. NEVER, NEVER RUN OR PLAY DEAD

How to Avoid or Survive an Encounter With a Mountain Lion

- 1. Do walk, hike, camp in groups
- 2. Do camp in open areas, meadows
- 3. Do make noise when in mountain lion territory
- 4. Do give the lion an escape route
- 5. Do stand your ground, back away slowly, keep eye contact
- 6. Do bunch together, keep children close
- 7. Do place small children on your shoulders, without bending
- 8. Do raise arms, bike, or jacket, above your head to look larger
- 9. Do throw items, yell, make noise: low pitch, growl, snarl


If Attacked, Fight Back

- 1. Use anything as a weapon if the lion displays aggression, but do not turn your back, crouch, kneel, or bend over to get one.
- 2. Use fists, sticks, rocks, tools, a pocket knife, a bicycle, whatever you can hit with, throw, and/or use as a shield.
- 3. Target an eye with your thumbs, fingers, or a weapon.
- 4. Carry pepper spray, but learn how to use it first.
- 5. Often the lion will give up.
